In a recent survey, more than 10,000 people who travel internationally on a regular basis were asked what part of travel planning they would like to be done by artificial intelligence (AI) in the near future. 75 percent of those surveyed want AI to handle "hotel booking." This is followed by "transport arrangement" and "passport renewal," chosen by 74 percent and 73 percent of the respondents respectively.

As predicted in the survey, a growing number of people have already adopted "AI travel planners," which have some obvious advantages, including the following:

- AI makes the process of travel planning simple, quick, and easy:

AI trip-planning tools can create a detailed itinerary* almost instantly after analyzing the data you have provided. You don't need to visit a travel agency to gather information or research extensively on the web anymore.

- AI offers personalized recommendations and creates customized itineraries: In case you haven't decided where to go and what to do during a vacation, AI planners can recommend a shortlist of destinations and activities that suit your preferences and design a trip specifically for you.

On the other hand, there are some issues regarding AI travel planners that you should be aware of. First, there is a risk of privacy violation because the personal information you share with an AI model – your address, age, family members, and so on – may be abused by an unauthorized party. Second, AI's recommendations may not be as valuable as the advice given by real people, such as those who have actually been to the places you plan to visit. Thus, you should complement an AI-generated itinerary with human insights to finalize your plan. Additionally, AI systems sometimes provide false information as if it were true, especially when the datasets they are trained on are outdated or biased.

As a first step of trip planning, I always use AI tools. However, I never fix every single detail of a trip before departure. I can be better informed about a destination after I arrive there and talk to the people who live there. Then, I often change my original schedule to visit some hidden places away from typical sightseeing routes. For example, I've seen many such places in Japan which are not well-known among foreign tourists but worth seeing.

The Rule of Adjective Order

There are unspoken rules in the English language that are rarely taught in schools but are followed by native speakers. One of these is the rule of adjective order. Simply put, this is the order of descriptive words used before a noun. This might sound basic, but if you asked the average English speaker to explain the rule for the order of adjectives, not many would be able to do so. I'll discuss the reasons for this at another time, so let's first break down the rule itself.

Now, to be clear, it isn't recommended to string many adjectives together. However, if you are going to, this rule will help create a natural sounding sentence. In their correct order, the 8 categories of adjectives are:

Order	Type of Adjective
1	18
2	Size
3	19
4	Shape
5	Color
6	20
7	Material
8	21

Let's see if you can notice the difference between these sentences: "that beautiful, old, red, Italian sports car" and "that red, beautiful, Italian, old sports car." Maybe, at first glance, they are similar; they use the exact same adjectives, after all. However, to a native English speaker, the former sentence will sound natural while the latter will sound odd.

The difference comes down to the order: opinion (e.g., "beautiful"), age ("old"), color ("red"), origin ("Italian"), and purpose ("sports"). Deviating* from this sequence can lead to confusion or even alter the intended meaning of a sentence altogether.

For example, the sentence "this old French painting" emphasizes the age of the painting while "this French old painting" emphasizes its French origin. More importantly, the latter is usually regarded as incorrect.

So, if we change the order, we change the meaning, too. But, where did this order come from? Unfortunately, there isn't a clear answer as to why adjectives are typically used in this order. Like many English grammatical rules, the reasoning behind them has been lost to time. Still, the rule persists, despite the fact that it is not taught in schools. Please remember adjective order because, as difficult as it may be to explain, it's fundamental for clear and effective communication in English.

Hydrogen Fuel - A Potential Alternative to Fossil Fuels -

Hydrogen, a chemical element with the symbol H, is expected to play a vital role in global efforts to achieve net-zero CO_2 emissions by 2050 because some basic properties of hydrogen make it an ideal alternative to fossil fuels. First, hydrogen is a flammable gas which has a high energy content: when it's burnt with oxygen, hydrogen releases a massive amount of energy. Second, hydrogen (H₂) reacts with oxygen (O) to form only water (H₂O). As it doesn't emit CO_2 emissions. Due to the high potential to contribute to decarbonization, hydrogen is considered an important fuel for a sustainable future.

Hydrogen rarely exists in its pure form in nature and thus needs to be extracted from other compounds. Today, about 95% of hydrogen produced worldwide is derived from liquified natural gas (LNG) through a high-temperature process called steam reforming. This type of hydrogen is classified as "gray hydrogen" because it releases CO_2 in the process of production. In order for hydrogen to be a truly clean energy option, gray hydrogen needs to be replaced by "green hydrogen," which is produced from water through a process called electrolysis. This production method is CO_2 -free when renewable energy is used to separate water (H₂O) into oxygen (O) and hydrogen (H₂). Currently, green hydrogen accounts for only about 5% of the total hydrogen output, but the percentage is expected to grow as the prices of renewable energy from solar or wind resources are falling steadily.

Today, hydrogen gas is transported from producers to consumers by road, by rail, or through pipelines. In the near future, large quantities of hydrogen will be stored in tanks on hydrogen-carrying ships and transported across the ocean. At -252.9° C, which is the boiling point of hydrogen, hydrogen gas turns liquid and is reduced to one eight-hundredth of its original volume. By applying advanced insulation technology, transport operators keep liquified hydrogen at extremely low temperatures throughout a long sea voyage.

The uses of hydrogen are diversifying mainly due to recent developments in fuel cell technology. Fuel cells generate electricity through the chemical reaction of hydrogen and oxygen. The most notable application of this technology is in passenger vehicles called FCEVs^{*}, which are known for their quick refilling, relatively long range, and zero CO₂ emissions. The same technology can be applied to commercial vehicles, such as trucks and buses, and possibly trains, boats, and aircrafts as well.

Despite these technological advancements at each stage of supply chains, hydrogen fuel is not widely adopted in any country and its high potential has not been fully realized yet. As is true with other means of achieving decarbonization, "economies of scale" would be the key to the widespread adoption of hydrogen fuel. With generous incentives offered by the government, more consumers would consider buying expensive hydrogen-powered vehicles, which would otherwise be out of their budget. If strong long-term demand for hydrogen fuel was created, fuel producers, transporters, and distributors would invest in new facilities to enhance capacity, which will lay the foundation for extended supply chains. When these companies achieve "economies of scale," larger quantities of hydrogen fuel will be produced, transported, and distributed and their business operations will be more efficient and profitable. This will likely lead to reductions in the prices of hydrogen fuel, which will accelerate the transition from fossil fuels to clean energy and help achieve net-zero CO₂ emissions by 2050.
